The programme for this tour will include **Schumann**'s Six Pieces in Canonic Form, Op.56, **Enescu**'s Piano Quartet No.2 in D minor, Op.30, **Beethoven**'s Prelude H40 and Fugue Op.137 for String Quintet, and **Mozart**'s String Quintet in G minor, K.516. Taking its name from that of the Czech composer who met his untimely death in Auschwitz, this hugely accomplished ensemble here selects a 1923 dance suite by a talented compatriot who died in a Nazi prison in 1942 – **Erwin Schulhoff**'s Five Pieces for String Quartet. Alongside this, the quartet has chosen to perform **Dvorak**'s String Quartet No. 11 in C major, Op.61, and **Debussy**'s String Quartet in G minor, Op. 10.

We are delighted that they have agreed to perform here at Champs Hill before they move onto their Wigmore Hall recital.

Amatis Trio

This young piano trio is regarded as one of the leading ensembles of its generation, and makes a welcome return to Champs Hill. Their choice of programme includes one of the few chamber works by **Liszt**, 'Tristia' S723C, alongside **Beethoven'**s Piano Trio No.3 in C minor, Op.1.

Having introduced, in June, our audience to the Russian romantic-era chamber music of **Arensky** when they were treated to a performance of his String Quartet No.2 in A minor, we are delighted that the Amatis Trio will be including arguably one of his finer works, the Piano Trio No.1 in D minor, Op.32 in this concert. This piece was dedicated to the memory of the legendary Russian cellist, Karl Davidoff, and is a wonderfully heartfelt and virtuosic addition to the programme.

This young, immensely talented prize-winning Bulgarian pianist has been attracting international attention since being awarded first prize at the 2019 Ferruccio Busoni piano competition in Italy. We are thrilled that he has been able to find time in his busy schedule to join us for this wonderful debut recital here. His chosen programme is **Beethoven**'s Sonata No.30, Op 109, **Mendelssohn**'s gloriously lyrical Lieder ohne Worte, Book II, Op.30, and finishing with **Schumann**'s virtuosic Symphonic Etudes, Op.13.
