It is fitting that the trio will be performing this at Champs Hill, alongside **Beethoven's** String Trio Op.3 (also in E flat major), a divertimento consisting of six movements including two minuets.

Exclusive Art Lectures (afternoon and evening) with Simon Gillespie, distinguished art restorer Thursday 27th January

Revitalising Breadwinners – a special lecture by Simon Gillespie introducing The Bowerman Charitable Trust's major new acquisition Breadwinners by Walter Langley, last exhibited in 1996!

Simon Gillespie is a fine art conservator whose studio has a global reputation for its work treating some of the finest works of art in private and public collections. Simon's experience covers artworks from the early Renaissance including paintings by Raphael, through Artemisia Gentileschi to more modern great masters such as Lucian Freud, Pablo Picasso, Damien Hirst, Banksy, Paula Rego and many more. You may recognise Simon from the well-loved BBC4 television programme Britain's Lost Masterpieces where he and art historian Bendor Grosvenor uncover some of the nation's overlooked gems.

Simon worked with David Bowerman from his very early days of collecting, and is delighted to be able to talk about the bringing back to life of this magnificent new acquisition.
