Johan Dalene first visited Champs Hill as part of the Petworth Festival in 2022. His wonderful concert, enthusiastically received by our audience, prompted us to request a return visit, this time accompanied by international soloist and chamber musician, Nicola Eimer. His diverse choice of programme includes **Beethoven**'s Sonata for Piano and Violin No.1 in D major, Op.12, **Grieg**'s musically nationalistic Sonata No. 2 in G major, Op.13, **Schoenberg**'s challenging intense, virtuosic rhapsody, Phantasy for Violin and Piano, Op.47, and **Franck**'s Sonata for Violin and Piano, one of the finest sonatas for these instruments ever written.

Steven Isserlis - cello Connie Shih - piano Friday 8th March

We are delighted that Steven has found time in his extremely busy international schedule to perform alongside the outstanding pianist, Connie Shih. Despite his involvement with the annual IMS Prussia Cove tour, this will be his first visit to Champs Hill in 13 years. His generous programme includes **Busoni**'s Kultaselle: Ten Short Variations on a Finnish Folk Song, BV 237, **Schubert**'s "Arpeggione Sonata", D.821 (originally written for the arpeggione or bowed guitar), **Faure**'s elegant and dreamy nostalgic Cello Sonata No.1, Op.109, and **Rachmaninoff**'s monumental Cello Sonata in G minor, Op.19, equally demanding for both players.

Royal College of Music Showcase - The Ashton Wind Octet <u>Afternoon Concert</u> - Thursday 21st March

These eight hugely talented Bachelor of Music students have been recommended by the Royal College to perform here, and are musicians from some of the top woodwind groups at the College. They are dedicated to showcasing works for wind octet, including a mixture of modern and more classical works, as well as exploring new repertoire. Their specially selected programme for Champs Hill includes **Krommer**'s Octet-Partita in F major, Op.57, Take Two Oboes by **Thea Musgrave**, the Hungarian folk-influenced Serenade for Six Wind Instruments by **Mátyás Seiber**, Figures in the Garden by **Jonathan Dove**, first commissioned by Glyndebourne and based on Mozart's opera, *The Marriage of Figaro*, and finishing with **Mozart**'s Serenade in C minor K.388.
