Stephen Hough - piano Saturday 27th September

One of the most distinctive artists of his generation, distinguished pianist, composer and writer, Stephen Hough, makes his debut at Champs Hill. His decidedly individual programme includes repertoire from Romantic giants alongside two towering 20th-century composers, as well as of some of his own bravura arrangements: **Schubert**: Klavierstück No. 2, D.946, **Brahms**: Klavierstück Op.118, No.6; **Schoenberg**: 6 Kleine Klavierstücke, Op.19; **Stockhausen**: Klavierstück III, the shortest of all his compositions; **Beethoven**: Bagatelle, Op.119, No.10 (just 13 bars long), and his majestic Piano Sonata No.21, Op.53 'Waldstein'; **Schumann**: Carnaval, Op. 9; and ending on the streets of Edwardian London with **Sherman**, **arr. Hough**: Mary Poppins Suite.
