# Alexandra Dariescu - piano Afternoon Concert - Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> January

Prior to her recital at the Queen Elizabeth Hall, we are delighted to welcome back Champs Hill favourite, Alexandra Dariescu, who has made it her mission to create concert programmes that give under-represented female composers equal billing with their better-known male colleagues.

In this kaleidoscopic journey through the wealth of music for piano written across the ages and around the world, she places miniature masterpieces by **Clara Schumann**, **Missy Mazzoli**, **Florence Price** and **Lili Boulanger**, among others, alongside those by **Bach**, **Villa-Lobos** and Dariescu's fellow Romanians **Enescu**, **Ciortea** and **Silvestri**.

Alexandra devotes the second half to the ultimate set of miniatures: **Chopin**'s 24 Preludes, brief pieces that are filled with evocative atmospheres and visceral drama. The Chopin also forms the main part of her "Preludes Vol.1" album on the Champs Hill Records label.

# Matthew Barley - cello Mishka Rushdie Momen - piano Friday 30<sup>th</sup> January

Matthew Barley is no stranger to Champs Hill, having performed here alongside his extraordinarily talented family members in October 2025. His previous eclectic and cross-genre programme is now replaced with a much more classical feel as he is joined by Mishka Rushdie Momen, hailed as "one of the most thoughtful and sensitive of British pianists".

Their chosen programme focuses on the Romantic giants of Brahms and Schumann: a selection of **Schumann** Songs, transcribed by Matthew Barley, **Schumann**'s Adagio and Allegro, Op.70; and **Brahms**' Cello Sonata No.1 in E minor, Op.38, with its roots firmly planted in the music of the past. Mishka will also take centre stage to display her exceptional talent as a concert pianist with two solo performances: **Ravel**'s Miroirs (*Oiseaux tristes* and *Alborada del gracioso*), and **Byrd**'s Fantasia in A minor.

### **Trio Gaspard**

Jonian Ilias Kadesha - violin Vashti Hunter - cello Nicholas Rimmer - piano **Friday 6**<sup>th</sup> **February** 

Prize-winning Trio Gaspard returns to Champs Hill as one of the most sought-after trios of its generation, praised for its unique and fresh approach to the score. As well as exploring and championing the traditional piano trio repertoire, Trio Gaspard works regularly with contemporary composers and is keen to commission and discover seldom-played masterpieces. Their programme includes recent works by two composers best known as performing artists, **Olli Mustonen** (Introduzione e Allegro alla Polacca) and **Patricia Kopatchinskaja** ("Roh-Rau" for Piano Trio), setting these distinctive pieces alongside consummate piano trios by **Haydn** (Piano Trio in F Major Hob.XV:2) and **Beethoven** (Piano Trio in E flat, Op.70 No.2). The ever-adventurous Gaspards also undertake the intense expressive landscape of **Arno Babadjanian**'s Piano Trio in F sharp minor of 1952, a cornerstone of 20th-century Soviet chamber music.

Their diverse programme includes **Farrenc**'s Trio Op.33 in E flat major; **Fauré**'s Piano Trio Op.120 in D minor (1st mvt); **Seiber**'s Introduction and Allegro, with its influences of Hungarian folk music; **Brahms**' Clarinet Trio Op.114 in A minor; and **Muczynski**'s (hailed as the most important neoclassical composer of post-war America) wonderfully energetic Fantasy Trio, Op.26.

#### Elias Quartet with Jâms Coleman

Sara Bitlloch - violin Donald Grant - violin Jâms Coleman - piano Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> March Simone van der Giessen - viola Marie Bitlloch - cello

Ensemble-in-residence at the RNCM, the Elias Quartet is known as one of the most intense and vibrant quartets of its generation, and this concert sees it collaborating with the extremely accomplished pianist, Jâms Coleman. Having studied and performed all of Beethoven's string quartets, it is appropriate that the quartet's programme focuses on this repertoire: **Beethoven**'s String Quartet in C minor, Op.18, No. 4 and his 'Harp' String Quartet in E-flat major, Op. 74, so called on account of the characteristic pizzicato sections in the allegro of the first movement. They close with **Dvořák**'s Piano Quintet in A major, Op.81, one of the finest examples of late Romantic chamber music.

Peter Moore - trombone

The youngest ever winner of the BBC Young Musician competition in 2008 aged just 12, and the youngest ever player and Principal Trombone of the LSO in 2014, Peter Moore is one of the finest trombonists on the global stage.

His first appearance at Champs Hill was in 2019 as part of Septura Brass Septet and he now joins us as a soloist alongside Zeynep Özsuca, international concert pianist, chamber musician and accompanist.

Their programme includes **Bach** - Oboe Concerto in D minor (after Marcello) arr. Ralph Sauer; **Schubert** - Ave Maria; **Stravinsky** - Pulcinella Suite; **Brahms** - Vier Ernste Gesänge; **Kreisler** - La Précieuse (in the style of Couperin); **Rameau-Kreisler** - Tambourin; and **Pryor** - La Petite Suzanne.

## **Confronting Illusion: Piers Ottey**

Our Spring 2026 exhibition 'Confronting Illusion' features a selection of stunning paintings by Sussex based artist Piers Ottey whose paintings are instantly recognisable.

His trademark 'colour code' around the edge of paintings, drawing marks and even mistakes/overpainting are all to be seen in these seemingly simple works. He works from his studio in West Sussex, on the edge of the Downs.

Much of Piers' work derives from visiting places at home and abroad. He has worked on images from the mountains of Switzerland to city paintings of San Francisco and London, where he was born and raised, but most often he returns to paint the Sussex landscape. Piers paints what he is passionate about – even his motorbikes! The process of painting is important, but so is the form: these paintings are characterised by rigorous structure, using geometry as well as varying surface textures and finishes.

Piers Ottey is represented by Kevis House Gallery, Petworth.
